Exercises recommended for K through 8:

Using Makers.com:

Take students on a journey through obstacles and triumphs.

Let student's own interests dictate what profiles to view. For instance, for those who have an interest in Ballet search for dancers; others might be interested in food or tennis.

Highlight Makers who are younger and who success appears more attainable.

Point out famous women they are likely to have heard of, but might not know why these women's names are familiar. Have you heard of Hillary Clinton? Condeleza Rice? Oprah?

When working on biographical pieces with students, use Makers.com to compliment any reading work.

When generally doing work on "Famous Americans" or "Famous Politicians" be sure to steer students toward these women who have made an impact on those fields and who are often overlooked.
