Health/Health Care	Building a Healthier Tri-State 203	1/4/13 at 12:30pm	30 minutes	This episode looked specifically at the after-school programs that offered in local schools and designed to promote activity and healthy living in students. Luce Elementary's walking program was one class featured in the program.
Health/Health Care	Building a Healthier Tri-State 204	1/11/13 at 12:30pm	30 minutes	This episode featured area college students and adults that have made a choice to participate in activities to improve their health. Interviews explored their personal experiences with making such dedicated lifestyle changes and the positive results they are experiencing.
Health/Health Care	PBS Newshour	1/27/13 at 6pm	10 minutes	In Preventing Violence, 'Very Hard to Identify' Individuals Who Need Help Most: Ray Suarez looks at responses by lawmakers and the NRA to President Obama's gun violence proposals. Jeffrey Brown hones in on the topic of mental health with Barry Rosenfeld, a clinical forensic psychologist at Fordham University, and Dr. Paramjit Joshi of the Children's National Medical Center in Washington, D.C.

Economy/Jobs	PBS Newshour	1/31/13 at 6pm	3 minutes	News Wrap: Senate Votes to Suspend Debt Limit Until May: In other news Thursday, the Senate voted to suspend the debt limit through mid-May 2013, allowing the government to continue borrowing to pay its bills. Also, American personal incomes hit an eight-year high in December 2012.
Arts Education	Art Futures	2/24/13 at 7pm	60 minutes	The result of a day-long studio forum, this special highlighted 7 areas of art through discussions with local artists/teachers. Aimed at middle school students, the program described ceramics, painting, writing, theatre, graphic arts, vocal music, and instrumental music. The types of careers available in each area and the education needed were covered.
Arts Education	Independent Lens: Ai Weiwei: Never Sorry	2/27/13 at 3am	90 minutes	Ai Weiwei is arguably the most internationally celebrated Chinese artist of the modern era. The inscrutable bearded visionary burst onto the scene with vast conceptual installations such as his eight million hand-painted ceramic sunflower seeds inside Tate Modern, and went on to design the iconic Bird's Nest stadium for the Beijing Olympics. But at heart, Ai Weiwei is a troublemaker with a serious agenda: to challenge the oppression of the Chinese people by their government with rebellious and irreverent gestures. His activism has cost him his freedom repeatedly, but he never seems to lose his childlike approach to serious dissidence executed with a wink.
Arts Education	Independent Lens: Beauty Is Embarrassing	1/27/13 at 10pm	90 minutes	Art-world darling Wayne White got his big break when he helped create the unhinged children's show "Pee-Wee's Playhouse." His off-kilter style and self-deprecating sense of humor offer a peek into an imagination that refuses to grow up. This film chronicles the vaulted highs and the crushing lows of this Tennessean commercial artist as he struggles to find peace and balance between his work and his art.
Environment/Pollution	Healthy Air: Healthy Communities 101	2/21/13 at 7pm	30 minutes	This first episode of 24 is produced in partnership with local agencies and designed to inform viewers about local pollution sources, levels, and actions that each citizen can take to reduce local air pollution. This first episode gave an overview and history of air pollution in our area.
Environment/Pollution	PBS Newshour	1/25/13 at 6pm	9 minutes	San Francisco on Track to Become Zero Waste City: San Francisco is trying to become the first city with zero waste. By requiring residents and businesses to separate compostable items such as food scraps, as well as recyclable items, NewsHour correspondent Spencer Michels reports that the city has already reduced a huge amount of garbage from ending

				up in landfills.
Environment/Pollution	Nova "Doomsday Volcanos"	1/2/13 at 8pm	60 minutes	The eruption of Iceland's Eyjafjallajökull volcano in 2010 turned much of the northern hemisphere into an ash-strewn no-fly zone. But Eyjafjallajökull was just the start. Katla, an Icelandic volcano 10 times bigger, has begun to swell and grumble. Two more giants, Hekla and Laki, could erupt without warning. Iceland is a ticking time bomb: When it blows, the consequences will be global. Meet scientists trying to understand those consequences — for air travel and for the global food supply and Earth's climate. Could we be plunged into years of cold and famine? What can we do to prepare for the coming disaster?
WWII History	LST-325: History on the Riverfront	3/21/13 at 9:30pm	30 minutes	This locally-produced documentary featured a tour and history lesson of the LST 325 war ship that has been restored and serves as a museum on the Evansville Riverfront.
Urban Development/ Infrastructure	In Harmony's Way: The Battle to Save a Bridge	3/13/13 at 7pm	60 minutes	Produced in association with USI, this program documented the history of the recent closed New Harmony Bridge. As the areas only way to cross the Wabash into Illinois, this bridge was built by private funds and was instrumental in the growth of the New Harmony area. Now condemned, the loss of the bridge has a huge impact on the people of the area that are trying to rebuild it.
Urban Development/ Infrastructure	PBS Newshour	1/3/13 at 6pm	11 minutes	Crumbling Pipes and Underground Waste: A Glimpse at Our Nation's Ailing Sewer System: As clean water regulations become tougher and sewer systems and water treatment plants become outdated, cities are struggling to stay compliant and safe. Science correspondent Miles O'Brien goes underground to discover the many ways America's sewer systems could be revamped to conserve water and save money.
