Topics covered included the downtown arena, Roberts Stadium, equal employment, and other topical issues
Election	Election 2011: Evansville City Council Debate	10/26/11 on 9.1	7:00pm	150 minutes	Candidates for Evansville Wards 2, 3, 5,6, and at-large were paired against each other to answer questions from the League of Women Voters of Southwestern Indiana.
Civil Rights	Newsmakers	10/20/11 on 9.1	7:00pm	30 minutes	This episode featured Jamal Smith from the Indiana Civil Right Commission as he answered as he discussed civil rights issues current in Indiana.
Economy	Newsmakers	10/27/11 on 9.1	7:00pm	30 minutes	This episode featured Ray Boshara and Avi Karnani from the US Federal Reserve as they discussed the current state of our economy.

Local schools that have implemented programs and infrastructure to promote safer routes to schools were highlighted.
