The topics of these episodes were Beyond The Schools, Fit For Life, and Built Environments from both the adult and child perspectives. Each episode presented personal testimony from participants in "healthy" programs.
The reintegration of Veterans into the Community	Carry Forward: Tri-State Vets Back Home	10/7/12 10/28/12	11:30pm 11:30pm	30 minutes	This program featured local war and service veterans talking about the issue they faced returning home. Issues include unemployment, housing, financial and emotional support, and health care concerns and services.
Election	Shively and Shoulders 2012 Election Analysis	11/8/12	7:00pm	60 minutes	This special one-hour live analysis feature local attorneys Les Shively and Pat Shoulders with local democrat Robert Dion and local republican Carol McClintock and they discussed the outcome of the recent local, state, and national elections.,
Black History	Snapshots of Southern Indiana	10/7/12	4:00pm	30 minutes	This local production focused on the history of local blacks. It featured the Evansville African Museum and highlighted the contents of the museum and the relevance of those contents to our local history.
Local Culture	EVSC Community Link	10/7/12 10/9/12	10:30pm and 6:00pm 1:00pm	30 minutes	This series, produced by the students of Bosse High School features various topics and local personalities.
Health	Regional Voices: Cheryl Mochau on Living Gluten Free	12/18/12	9:30pm	30 minutes	This taped presentation featured local expert Cheryl Mochau as she explained the problems with Gluten and how you can live a Gluten Free Lifestyle.
