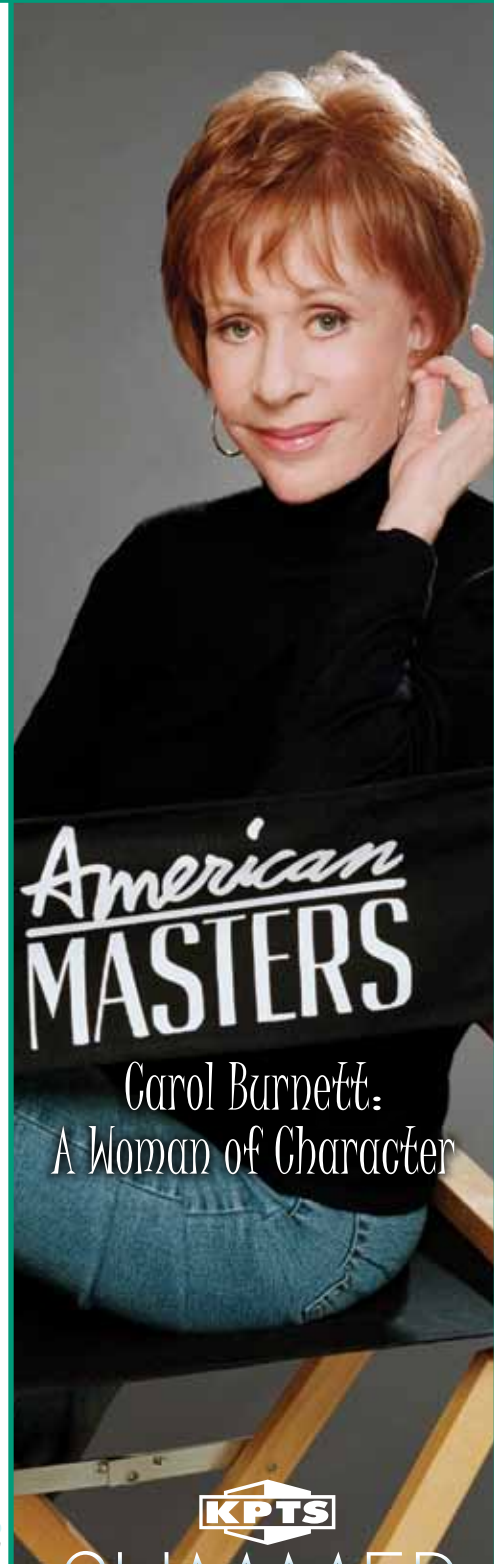

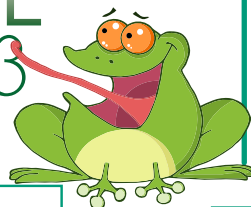

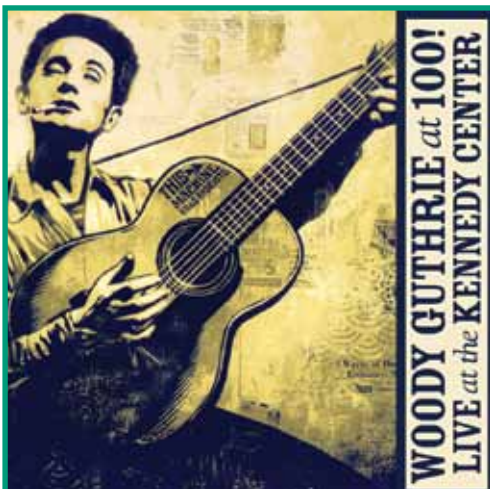

The Lost Years of ZORA NEALE HURSTON



Tuesday, June 11 @ 8:30PM

Writer, folklorist and anthropologist Zora Neale Hurston, a celebrated (and sometimes controversial) figure of the Harlem Renaissance, first rose to prominence with *Mules and Men* (1935) and cemented her reputation soon after with her 1937 masterwork, *Their Eyes Were Watching God*. However, few know about the woman behind this widely read and highly acclaimed novel — particularly the last 10 years of her life. This documentary delves into the writer's life, work and philosophies, concentrating on her very productive, but often overlooked, final decade. Interviews with Hurston experts and colleagues, letters from Hurston, and archival photographs piece together this fascinating chapter in the life of an American literary icon.
