ONE-MINUTE BIOGRAPHY

with Maggie Smith

Dame Maggie Smith was born on December 28, 1934, in Ilford, England. Her prolific career began on stage in Oxford and then London. Smith joined Britain's National Theatre Company in 1963 and in 1964 she starred in *Othello* with Laurence Olivier. She returned to her role as Desdemona in the 1965 motion picture version, again with Olivier.

Smith won her first Academy Award in 1969 for her lead role in *The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie*, and won again in 1978 for her role in *California Suite*. She was also nominated for *A Room with a View* and *Gosford Park*.

In the last 10 years, Smith has appeared in many other films, including the *Harry Potter* series, *Becoming Jane*, *The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel*, *Quartet*, and *The Lady in the Van*.

Smith was made a Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire (DBE) in 1990 and a Companion of Honour (CH) in 2014.

Viewers have come to love Smith's portrayal of Violet Crawley, the dowager countess of Grantham, on the award-winning ***Masterpiece Classic: Downton Abbey***, which airs on WYCC PBS Chicago **Thursdays at 8 p.m.**

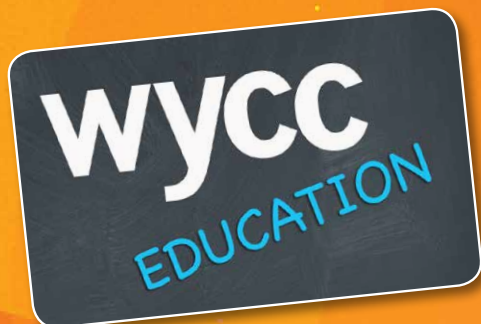
Focus: Literature, Inventions **Grades:** 9–12 **Airing:** Wednesday, November 11 at 1 p.m.
