AIDS	Lest We Forget	10/15/13	4:00pm	30 minutes	LEST WE FORGET captures the moments everyone shared ... the anguish we felt hearing 70,000 names being read while walking among the 24 football fields of memorial panels of the Quilt ... the excitement we experienced at seeing a U.S. president and vice president finally visit the Quilt for the first time in its ten- year history ... the tears we shed for those we loved ... the hope we have for the day when the nightmare of AIDS will end.

Black History	Mary Bateman Clark	10/24/13	4:00pm	1 hour	Mary Bateman Clark: A Woman of Colour and Courage explores the pursuit of freedom and equality—a theme central to American history and to the complex and changing notions of race, slavery, and the law that existed in antebellum America, even in the North. The program focuses on the Indiana Supreme Court case of <i>In re Mary Clark</i> (1821).
Black History	Why I Sing	11/7/13	4:30pm	30 minutes	The call to worship can vary by denomination, but many of the same spiritual traditions have lived in the black church for centuries. The documentary and discussion will explore topics of spirituality, rituals, powers, and leadership in the black church.
Culture	So It Goes	11/28/13	4:00pm	60 minutes	Kurt Vonnegut's lecture at Clowes Memorial Hall in Indianapolis. The lectures turned out to be the last work Vonnegut wrote for public consumption. He died two weeks before his scheduled lecture, but the speech was movingly delivered by Vonnegut's son Mark.
