Indiana History	Hoosiers	101 7/13/16 102 7/20/16	5:00pm	60 minutes/each	A four-hour documentary series based upon the definitive history of Indiana by James Madison called "Hoosiers: A New History of Indiana". Madison has worked in partnership with WFYI producers over the past year to bring the state's 200 years of history to life. The programs add a dimension to the state's history by exploring it through the descendants of ordinary Hoosiers who lived through extraordinary times, and who helped to shape the fabric of our state. In addition to exploring the pivotal events in Indiana history, Hoosiers also reveals some of the lesser-known chapters of the Indiana experience. The series culminates in a program that explores the past, present, and future, as they intersect to reveal the Next Indiana.

Indiana Business	Inside Indiana Business	Sundays at 6pm, Mondays at 4pm, Tuesdays at 5pm, Weds at 6pm, and Fridays at 6pm.		60 minutes	This weekly series features up-to-date business news from the State. Highlights include business innovations, expansions, news, mergers, etc. The series is hosted by Gerry Dick.
Legal Issues	Indiana Courts	Sundays at 5pm, Tuesdays at 6pm, and Saturdays at 4pm		60 minutes	This series consists of various Indiana Supreme Court appeals that have occurred over the past several years. These trials portray a variety of cases and crimes and allow viewers to hear the arguments and rulings.
Education	Graduating Indiana	7/21/16	5:30pm	30 minutes	Graduating Indiana is a critical look at the educational landscape in Indiana, including a discussion targeted at the persistently low high school graduation rates. This program features leaders in the Central Indiana education community and aims to open the conversation about providing every child with access to a quality education.
African American History	Indiana Trailblazers	101 8/4/16 102 8/11/16	4pm	60 minutes/each	Trace the steps of African-Americans as they migrate from the southern slave states and organize prosperous black settlements and thriving commerce centers across Indiana. You will learn about the state's black legislators in the early 1900's, including attorney Henry J. Richardson (deceased) who was on the front lines of the legal fight for equality across Indiana and the country, as told by his sons for the first

					time. Richardson's landmark legal and civic work serve as a backdrop for the discussion regarding disparate treatment, socially and educationally, as more state black leaders emerge and join the fight for racial equality.
State Politics/Government	Thriving Communities, Thriving State: Indiana Gubernatorial Forum	9/7/16	4:30pm	90 minutes	Randall Shepard, former Chief Justice of the Indiana Supreme Court, will moderate the forum. Candidates will join Shepard one at a time for conversations of about half an hour each. Shepard will pose the same set of questions to each candidate, time permitting. Gubernatorial candidates confirmed to participate in the discussions are Democrat John Gregg and Libertarian Rex Bell. The Republican gubernatorial candidate is TBA.
Education	Making Connections: Dropout Prevention	9/21/16	5:00pm	60 minutes	Our moderator and panelists will explore the unique challenges that rural districts face in regard to supporting students at risk of dropping out of high school. They also will share dropout prevention strategies used in a rural Indiana school district and discuss how current dropout prevention research applies in rural communities. The event will feature John Hill, Ph.D., executive director of the National Rural Education Association; Caitlin Howley, Ph.D., fellow at ICF International; and Terry Sargent, Ph.D., superintendent of Jennings County Schools (Indiana).
