They will shut down three of four coal power plants and leave one that they joint own with Alcoa. Natural gas and solar energy will replace those plants.

Economics/Environment: Water Energy Nexus	WNIN News	12/23/16	8:55am	3:40	Wastewater and water facilities consume around 3 percent of all power in the US, and the electric bills are often millions of dollars. Fort Wayne's wastewater treatment plant is turning treated waste into electricity which cuts their consumption requirements by a third, lowered the monthly electric bill by \$40,000, and benefits the environment by running on the methane gas produced in the waste breakdown process instead of burning that methane and releasing CO2 into the atmosphere. Other IN cities, including Evansville, are following this trend of converting and producing their power on site to treat wastewater.
