Issue	Program	Date	Time	Duration	Type/Description
<b>War/History</b>	Evansville At War	1/1/17	2:00-4:00pm	120 minutes	This local series told the story of Evansville's contribution to WWII through personal stories and testimonies. The manufacturing of the LSTs in the shipyard, Thunderbolt planes at Republic Aviation, and bullets were an example of Evansville's contribution to the war effort.
<b>Local Culture</b>	Live Local in Warrick County	1/1/17	4:00pm	30 minutes	This local special highlighted agribusiness, farmer's markets, and the may summer events that make Warrick County such a special place to visit and live.
<b>Careers/Employment</b>	Career Pathways: Taking the Technical Lane	1/1/17	11:30pm	30 minutes	This local program presented the many benefits to seeking a career in manufacturing. Aimed at students interested in a technical path, the program focused on the jobs available, the skills required, and the many benefits such as salaries, insurance, etc.
<b>Poverty</b>	Old Dreams, New Ideas	2/3/17	4:30am	30 minutes	This local program asked the question of whether the American dream is still alive and if it has changed. Through interviews with a diverse group of people, it was concluded the dream is still alive in our area, but much more difficult to achieve.
<b>Arts/Music</b>	Sunset at Semper Fulgens	3/23/17	7:00pm	60 minutes	This locally-produced special was a combination of concert and documentary as viewers watched opera singer Matthew O'Neill welcome a friend and renowned piano player to Evansville to play an intimate concert.
<b>Local History</b>	The Field That Bosse Built	2/12/17	3:00pm	60 minutes	This locally-produced documentary focused on the history behind Bosse Field, one of the oldest sports fields in the U.S. It examined the history of the field and the changes and events over the course of its history. Local sports figures and major players in the field's development were featured.
<b>Business</b>	JA Hall of Fame	3/26/17	5:00pm	60 minutes	Three local businessmen were highlighted and received awards during this program. The program included a background of each awardee's contribution to the area.
<b>Arts/Youth/Education</b>	Shorts by High Schoolers	1/26/17	7:00pm	90 minutes	This special highlighted a WNIN video contest for high school students. It presented 6 finalists and the two winning teams. One in the documentary category and the other in the feature category. Viewers were presented each entry, synopsis from a panel of three judges, and comments from the students.
<b>Indiana Legislature</b>	Lawmakers 2016	1/1/17-3/31/17	Sundays at 11am	30 minutes	This series featured local lawmakers discussing the week's events at the Statehouse during their session.
