At the top of the list, was maintaining the balanced budget, and the possible uses for the reserved funds that were recently discovered.
Community Health Evansville's Obesity Problem	Building a Healthier Tri-State	Sundays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays 2/12- 2/18	1am, 3:30am, 7am, 10am, 1pm	30 minutes	This locally-produced series focused on local issues of health. Topics included, Community Design, Complete Streets, Food Access, Changing our Food Culture, and Safe Routes to Schools. Each episode highlighted the problem and solutions that local groups have instituted
Children's Health Obesity and Behavioral Problems with youth in Henderson, KY	Growing Up Healthy in Henderson	Sundays, Wednesdays, Saturdays, 2/12-2/18	2am, 5:30am, 9am, 1pm	60 minutes	This live forum featured a variety of health and behavioral experts from the Henderson Kentucky area as they discussed obesity and behavioral problems in children. Rated as the two top health concerns for children in Northwestern Kentucky, this program provided an interactive means for viewers to ask question and learn about the options and solutions available.
Blood Supply	Tri-State Focus	Sundays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays 3/25 – 3/31	12am, 3am,, 6am, 9am, 12pm, 3pm	30 minutes	This episode focused on our local blood supply and reports of tainted blood. Red Cross officials explained the process of collecting, testing and storing blood supplies to ensure they are safe .
Energy Consumption	Energy: Learn, Act, Save	Sunday and Wednesday 2/19 – 2/25	2am, 5am, 8am, 11am	60 minutes	This pre-recorded forum featured local experts in the areas of energy conservation and usage. The panel discussed 'green' building techniques and viewers had the opportunity to take a visual tour of several local "green" buildings.
Black History	Snapshots of Southern Indiana Lyles Station	Sunday, Wednesday, and Saturday 1/29 – 2/4	2am, 5am, 8am, 11am, 2pm	30 minutes	This locally-produced program looked at the rich history and impact that Lyles Station had on the black population in our area. It examined the school, the area, and the people who were instrumental in building the community.
