Air Pollution/Health	Healthy Air Healthy Communities	7/25/13 7/28/13	7:00pm 12:30pm	30 minutes 30 minutes	This episode focused on sustainability in Vanderburgh County. Walking Paths, Biking Paths, Sidewalks, and Compact Communities were explained and reviewed by local experts.
Air Pollution/Health	Healthy Air Healthy Communities	8/22/13 8/26/13	7:00pm 10:00pm	30 minutes	This episode focused on efforts being made in Henderson County towards making the community easier to navigate via alternative forms of transportation such as buses, bikes, walking. The program also looked at how the Riverfront is being used by pedestrians.

(Warrick County) Viewers were educated about Boonville's new master plan to revitalize downtown with a new bypass to reduce truck traffic, more walking opportunities, and green space. It also focused on new and proposed bike paths in both towns.

Local Infrastructure	Investing in Evansville's Sewer System	9/16/13 9/22/13	7:00pm 4:00pm	60 minutes	This live forum feature local experts as they presented the problems with Evansville's outdated sewer system, the fines the city is paying the EPA, the new water and sewer fees that will be imposed and the repairs that will be made. Viewers interacted with the experts via phone calls, twitter, and email.

War Veterans	Carry Forward: Tri- State Vets Back Home	9/29/13	4:00pm	30 minutes	This locally-produced program featured testimonials from local war veterans as they described their trials with integrating back into society after the war. Viewers gained insight into the mental, social, and economic problems that most Vets faced returning from service.
Crime/Legal Issues/Law Enforcement	Brains on Trial with Alan Alda Episode Title: Determining Guilt	9/11/13	9:00pm	60 minutes	On trial is Jimmy Moran, who at 18 took part in a store robbery during which the storeowner's wife was shot and grievously injured. Presiding is distinguished U.S. District Judge Jed S. Rakoff, who has a longstanding interest in neuroscience and its

					conceivable effect on criminal law. The trial raises common questions: Is a witness lying? How reliable is eyewitness testimony? What's the best way to avoid a biased jury? How well can the defendant's intentions be judged? Alan Alda explores how brain-scanning technology is providing insights into these questions and discusses the implications of neuroscience entering the courtroom. This episode showcases the guilt phase of Moran's trial. We peer into the brains of others in the courtroom: the witnesses, judges and jurors.
